






Following a devastating fire, this five-story historical building in Straubing's Old Town required extensive renovation work. Part of this work involved combining the fourth and fifth stories to create a large loft with a roof terrace for a young family. For the client, an important aspect of the design was the combination of modern and exquisite second-hand materials – a sort of bourgeois bohemian style. Douglas fir was used to form room-length floor boards that have been oiled white. The same material was also used for the built-in cube, limestone was used for some of the floors and the washbasins; brass for the kitchen block, lights, armatures and fittings, and raw steel for the stairs. Black medium-density wood fiber panels cover a large storage cupboard. The combination of linear structures with modern elements and the integration of old furniture with signs of wear give this home a vital character.
